

## BROTHER JOSEPH WALSH, O.P.

Brother Joseph Walsh, O.P., died of a heart attack on January 9, 1963 at St. Vincent Ferrer Priory in New York. He had been ill for a number of years.

Brother Joseph was born in Manayunk, Pennsylvania on August 2, 1883. He was educated in St. John the Baptist's parochial school. Brother entered the Dominican Order in September, 1912 at St. Joseph's Priory, Somerset, Ohio, and was professed the following year. After spending a year at the Dominican House of Studies, Washington, D. C., Brother Joseph was assigned to St. Vincent Ferrer's Priory, where he remained until his death. During his long and fruitful stay at St. Vincent's, Brother distinguished himself for his piety and industry.

On January 12, 1963, Very Rev. Robert L. Every, O.P., Prior, sang the Solemn Requiem Mass in St. Vincent Ferrer Church, New York. The deacon and subdeacon were Rev. Joseph X. Strenkert, O.P., and Rev. Charles A. Farrell, O.P., respectively. Very Rev. William R. Dillon, O.P., P.G., preached at the Mass. Bro. Raymond Jarboe, O.P., and Bro. Pius McCormick, O.P., were the servers. Burial was at Holy Souls Cemetery, Pleasantville, N. Y.

In attendance at the funeral Mass was Very Rev. William D. Marrin, O.P., Provincial of Saint Joseph Province.
