he studied at St. Joseph's Priory, Somerset, Ohio, and the Dominican House of Studies, Washington, D.C. He was ordained on May 17, 1916 by Bishop Thomas J. Shahan, rector of the Catholic University.

Following ordination, Fr. Newman taught at Aquinas College, Columbus, Ohio, for six years. He then did parish work until 1931. The following years were spent in missionary activity. Father Newman was later assigned at St. Louis Bertrand Priory in Louisville, Ky., and St. Rose Priory in Springfield, Ky.

On February 22, the Very Rev. Patrick J. Conaty, O.P., Prior at St. Rose, celebrated the Solemn Mass of Requiem. Rev. James F. McManus, O.P., was deacon and Rev. Salvatore B. Matarazzo, O.P., was subdeacon. The Very Rev. John A. Foley, O.P., P.G., preached the eulogy. Rev. Joseph B. Soeldner, O.P. and Rev. Matthew F. Chen, O.P. were the servers of the Mass. Fr. Newman's body was buried at St. Rose's cemetery in Springfield, Ky.

### THE REVEREND EUGENE A. BRADY, O.P.

The Reverend Eugene Antoninus Brady, O.P. died last February in Philadelphia, Pa. after a long illness. He was sixty-three years old.

Father Brady was born in Newark, N.J. on May 23, 1900. He received his early education at St. Antoninus' and St. Patrick's parochial schools. Later he attended St. Benedict's College in Newark, N.J. and Seton Hall College in South Orange, N.J.

Upon entering the Dominican Order in 1921, Father Brady studied at St. Joseph's Priory, Somerset, Ohio; St. Rose's Priory, Springfield, Ky. and the Dominican House of Studies, Washington, D.C. He was ordained at St. Dominic's Church, Washington, D.C. by Bishop Thomas J. Shahan, rector of Catholic University, on June 21, 1928.

Assigned to Holy Name Priory, Kansas City, Mo., Father Brady began his long career in parochial work. In 1934, he was transferred to St. Vincent Ferrer's Priory, New York, where he stayed eight years. He then went to Holy Name Priory, Philadelphia, Pa. and remained there until his death.
