Him sons of God, and if sons, continues the Apopstle, heirs also,— "heirs indeed of God and joint-heirs with Christ." Thus we were raised to a higher degree of dignity than that from which we had fallen. Yes, the chief purpose of Our Lord was that since we "the children are partakers of flesh and blood. He also Himself in like manner . . . (might be) partaker of the same: that through death. He might destroy him who had the empire of death, that is to say, the devil;" and that He might deliver us from his servitude.18 "He gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from all iniquity and might cleanse to Himself a people acceptable, a pursuer of good works,"19

Oh God, how can we, such poor, feeble creatures, thank Thee for such an infinite manifestation of love and condescension? Surely the only fitting expression of our gratitude and the only one really acceptable to the Father, is a submissive adherence to the words and teachings of Jesus His Son. Woe to us indeed, if after God so loved the world as to give His only begotten Son,"20 we should make void this gift of gifts. Our prayer, dear heavenly Father, is that the coming of Thy Son into the world may be the means by which we will have life everlasting. Amen.
