The priest when clad in sacred vestments, holds the place of Christ, that he may humbly pray to God for himself and for all men. Before him he wears the cross on the chasuble, that he may diligently observe the footsteps of Christ and endeavor to follow in them. When the priest celebrates Mass, he honors God, he rejoices the angels, he edifies the holy Church; he helps the living, obtains mercy for the dead and makes himself partaker of all good things.
