Reverend James G. Crombie, O.P.

Rev. James G. Crombie, O.P., President of Aquinas College High School, died of a heart attack February 27. He was 50 years old.

A native of Thompsonville, Conn., Father Crombie was educated in St. Joseph's parochial school and a public high school in Thompsonville. He attended George Washington University, Washington, D.C.; Providence College, Providence, R.I.; St. Rose College, Springfield, Ky.; the College of the Immaculate Conception, Washington, D.C., where he also attended the Catholic University.
