

Reverend Edward T. Quinlan

The Reverend Father Edward Timothy Quinlan died after a long illness, in Crittendon General Hospital, Detroit, Michigan, on July 18, 1964.

Father Edward Quinlan was born in Jersey City, New Jersey, March 7, 1903. He was educated in the public grammar and high schools of Jersey City; Aquinas College High School, Columbus, Ohio; Providence College, Providence, Rhode Island. He entered the novitiate of the Dominican Order in St. Rose's near Springfield, Kentucky and attended the houses of study in St. Joseph's near Somerset, Ohio, River Forest, Illinois and The Immaculate Conception Priory in Washington, D.C. Father Quinlan was ordained at St. Dominic's, Washington, D.C., June 5, 1941, by Archbishop Michael J. Curley of Baltimore, Maryland.

After his ordination Father Quinlan did parish work at St. Mary's, New Haven, Connecticut. His recent assignment was at St. Vincent Ferrer's Parish, Madison Heights, Michigan. He was Holy Name Director there.

Father's funeral Mass was celebrated in St. Vincent Ferrer's Church. The Reverend Father W. J. Tierney, O.P. was celebrant, with Father J. J. Reichart, O.P. as Deacon and Father C. V. Lucier, O.P. as Subdeacon. Father John J. Sullivan delivered the eulogy and Fathers James D. Keating, O.P. and Edward D. LeBlanc, O.P. served the Mass. Father Quinlan's body was laid to rest in St. Joseph's cemetery, Somerset, Ohio.
