THE VERY REV. BERNARD F. LOGAN, O. P., P. G.

Within half an hour after he had given out the Rosary of the Lenten Devotions at St. Raymond's Church, Providence, R. I., on the evening of March 9th, the Very Rev. Bernard F. Logan, O. P., P. G., passed to his eternal reward.

Fr. Logan entered the Dominican Order at the Convent of St. Rose, Springfield, Ky., in 1874, and was ordained to the Holy Priesthood on Nov. 28, 1883. During most of his thirty-nine years as a priest, Fr. Logan held important positions of trust, some of which were the pastorates of St. Dominic's Church, Denver, Col., St. Patrick's Church, Columbus, O., Holy Rosary Church, Minneapolis, Minn., St. Louis Bertrand's Church, Louisville, Ky., St. Vincent Ferrer's Church, New York City, and St. Raymond's Church, Providence, R. I.

A very forcible preacher, an incessant worker and of distinguished ability in the management of a parish, he received, a few years ago, the high honor of Preacher General.

His sympathy for the poor, his kindness towards sinners, his deep religious spirit, his untiring zeal and his good will endeared him to the hearts of all with whom he came in contact. That he was recognized as a faithful priest, true friend and representative citizen was evidenced at the Mass by the vast attendance not only of his own parishioners but also of many non-Catholics.

On Tuesday, March 14th, the Solemn Pontifical High Mass of Requiem was sung by the Rt. Rev. William A. Hickey, Bishop of Providence. Deacons of Honor were: Very Rev. William D. Noon, O. P., S. T. M., and Very Rev. John A. Dempsey, O. P., S. T. Lr., Deacon of the Mass; Very Rev. John F. Doran; Subdeacon, Rev. Fr. Craig; Archpriest, Mgr. Peter E. Blessing; Master of Ceremonies, Rev. Peter A. Foley. The eulogy was delivered by the Very Rev. D. J. Kennedy, O. P., S. T. M.

Interment was at St. Francis Cemetery, where the burial service was read by the Very Rev. Raymond Meagher, O. P., S. T. Lr., Provincial. —Bro. Edmund Rocks, O. P.
